

### A Learning Progression

The most important lesson is better proficiency in technology. Before entering the program I had never used much technology. Now I regularly utilize webcams, video chat, online videos, and much more in my daily life. Utilizing my technological resources has made me into a much more effective teacher. In all my lessons I now incorporate some form of technology. Therefore I am a better person as a result of the Master of Arts program.

Where am I? I have now been an educational professional for four years. I am at a point in my career where I have developed a learning philosophy.
